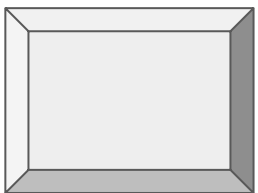


Problem Solving

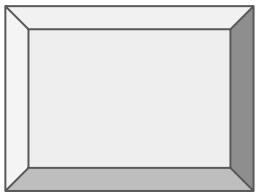
